As Headteacher of Lamphey Primary School, I am delighted to share the outcome of the school's recent Estyn inspection in November. The positive feedback from Estyn reflects the dedication and commitment of all at Lamphey Primary School to providing high-quality education and fostering a nurturing environment for all its pupils.

As well as the many strengths highlighted, the inspection team identified two recommendations to help the school to continue to improve and these are:

- Sharpen self-evaluation to ensure that the school has a clear understanding of the impact of its work on pupil progress.
- Increase opportunities for pupils to develop as effective independent learners.

Mr Mike Ridout, Chair of Governors commented -

. In my role as Chair of Governors I regularly see the work of the staff and management team at school and I am delighted to see their efforts recognised by Estyn. As a retired Estyn inspector I know that Estyn does not make comments such as **'supported pupils well-being exceptionally well'**, pupil behaviour across the school was **'exemplary'**, is a **'highly inclusive school'** and nearly all pupils made **'exceptionally effective progress'** without having strong evidence to support those comments.

This is a report of which the school staff, the parents and especially the pupils can be very proud. It confirms what we already knew, that Lamphey School has a 'nurturing and harmonious atmosphere' and that high standards of behaviour and achievement are set for all pupils.'
