## **UNIFORM POLICY**

### **Introduction**

At Lamphey Primary School we believe that a school uniform is important because:

- It looks smart.
- Wears well.
- Contributes to a sense of belonging.
- Gives a common purpose.
- Fosters a feeling of pride.

We ask that all children wear the Lamphey School uniform and we encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

### **What is the Lamphey School uniform?**

Our school uniform is as follows:

Grey or dark skirt, shorts or trousers.

Gold polo shirts.

Red sweatshirt or cardigan.

In the Summer, children may wear red/white gingham dresses or shorts and polo shirts (as above)

### **Purchasing the Lamphey School uniform**

Items with the Lamphey logo can be purchased from St Brides Bay Clothing, Tees R Us or any other supplier of the parents/carers choice. In addition to uniform other items are also available e.g. caps, reading bags etc. are sold all emblazoned with the Lamphey School logo. Non-branded items of clothing in school colours may be bought from any supplier and be worn as school uniform.

## **PE kits**

All children will need a P.E. bag containing shorts, t-shirt and trainers, and for swimming a bathing costume, swimming hat, goggles and towel. Children will not be allowed to participate unless properly dressed.

The School prospectus contains information about the PE kit required. This is presented to all parents on entering the school.

## **Please Remember....**

Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons, bobbles etc. should be fairly simple and if possible in school colours.

Parents are asked to ensure that all items are labelled clearly with their child's name.

For safety reasons we ask that the children do not wear jewellery in school. If earrings are to be worn then they must be studs.

The Governors and Staff hope that parents choosing to send their children to Lamphey Primary School will support the 'ethos' of the school by sending their children in agreed school dress.
